Letter from the Artistic Director



Shirley Serotsky (she/her) Producing Artistic Director

Dear Friends of the Hangar:

The Hangar's 2022 Season, its 48th in the books (if anyone is counting!) included five Mainstage productions, four KIDDSTUFF Theatre for Young Audiences shows, three Hangar Wedge FutureNow theatre workshops, and 21 week-long sessions of the Hangar's Next Generation School of Theatre. Our lineup included radiant performances of buzz-worthy shows that played to intergenerational audiences from central New York and beyond, featuring authentic human stories from around the world.

In 2022, audiences and critics alike shared rave reviews, including the following survey feedback:

- "The show was phenomenal! Haunting and yet exquisitely beautiful. I so so appreciate the new pay-as-you-go policy that allows students to afford tickets-it means so much!"
- "It was truly amazing!! The best show I have ever seen at the Hangar-and
 I have seen many great performances there. We LOVED it!! The music and
 dancing were amazing, and the actors were phenomenal! So was the story
 itself. Outstanding!"
- "Phenomenal production-the cast is extraordinarily talented, the set was
 engaging and the actor musicians were magnetic! Keep it up-the diversity,
 the excellence and the vision."
- Our 2022 production of Natasha, Pierre & The Great Comet of 1812 was named the Best Theatrical Performance of 2022 in the annual Ithaca Times Reader's Poll.

Our 2022 KIDDSTUFF productions were popular with audiences throughout the summer with several of the showings playing to sold-out crowds. Audience surveys from 2022 KIDDSTUFF shows also shared the following positive feedback:

- "I saw the discounted tickets and bought them for my family...Acting was great!!!"
- "My daughter loved it. I grew up going to plays and shows often and love sharing the experience with her. Great cast."

We played to enthusiastic crowds throughout the summer and our out-of-town attendance (patrons from 50+ miles away) increased from 19% in 2021 to 27% in 2022, due to a particularly strong and consistent seasonal social media presence, successful regional marketing campaigns, and exceptional word-of-mouth reports. Our percentage of attendance from outside Tompkins County was 44% (up from 30% in 2021).

The Hangar's Project 4 Arts-in-the-Classroom residency program continues to be our most accessible and far-reaching community program, bringing experienced Teaching Artists into fourth-grade classrooms throughout Tompkins County to guide young people in the creation and performance of original, student-devised plays inspired by NY State curriculum. We were thrilled to relaunch in-person Project 4 residencies in 2022, engaging with three

Tompkins County school districts (ICSD, Newfield, and Dryden) and 8 elementary schools; for a total of 28 classrooms and approximately 450 students and 35 classroom educators. Performance days, held at the schools and at the Hangar, welcomed over 1,000 invested family and community members to experience (in-person and virtually) the meaningful productions their young people created. Project 4 teacher feedback in spring 2022 included the following comments: "Kids get so much more out of programs like these than they do sitting at a desk...Students were able to practice cooperation, risk-taking, performance, empathy, kindness, and so many other skills."; "We loved sharing with each other during our dress rehearsal but sharing with the families was even more touching and joyful. It was the first time families had been inside the school building in two years!"

I'll also share: 2022 presented some significant challenges. As we continued to navigate a world shaped by the pandemic, we-like many arts organizations nationwide-realized that our hope that audiences would return quickly to pre-pandemic numbers was overly optimistic.

By fall 2022, we recognized that in order to continue to provide the myriad arts and education experiences we typically produce, first and foremost, we need to be solvent and sustainable. We have been doing our best to observe and listen, with this in mind: what truly serves the region? What can we offer, as an arts organization, that helps make the Ithaca area a great place to live, work, and play?

With this reinvigorated awareness of community in mind, we've programmed a season that will offer three Mainstage productions-including the hit musical *Billy Elliot*, four KIDDSTUFF productions, and the second year of the FutureNow Wedge Festival, which will include three new play workshops and a series of free, all-ages arts education classes for the community.

Our season opener is the remarkable breakout hit from 2017, What the Constitution Means to Me by Heidi Schreck-which started as a boundary stretching off-off-Broadway production, and ended up as an award-winning play on Broadway in 2019. We're co-producing the play with the Kitchen Theatre Company, in a new shared venture that we hope will mark a new era of true collaboration and partnership among arts organizations in Ithaca, recognizing that we truly are stronger when we work together.

Liebe: This year, we offered *Red Riding Hood* as an entertainment option for families during the snowy month of February.

Nichole: And our producing artistic director Shirley Serotsky has reimagined our summer season to leverage our resources, provide a more humane working environment for staff, and still provide the quality summer thought-provoking and entertaining work that makes us all love The Hangar.

Liebe: And did you notice Nichole said PRODUCING Artistic Director.
As a show of confidence in the job Shirley has done these past two years, the board has promoted her to Producing Artistic Director.

Nichole: I'd like to take a minute to recap some of Shirley's, and the entire Hangar family's accomplishments from Summer 2022.

Liebe: 8,690 people attended School Girls, Cabaret, Natasha, Pierre & The Great Comet of 1812, The Great Leap, and Trans Am and the best audience feedback was "This was my favorite experience in Ithaca this summer."

Nichole: Kiddstuff entertained 2,251 people with Cinderella, Three Little Birds, and the audience favorite Dragons Love Tacos. Project 4, our longstanding education program, engaged in residencies at Northeast, Caroline, Belle Sherman, Dryden, Cayuga Heights, South Hill and Fall Creek Elementary Schools!

Liebe: And if you're curious about Project 4. It is our teaching artists leading students to create their own script through theatre exercises, improvisation games, and movement. Students share their play with an audience! Several of our schools also participate in a "Hangar Day," during which students tour the theater and engage in a Q&A with Hangar staff before rehearsing and sharing their pieces on the Hangar stage.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Hangar Theatre's programs reach young people and emerging artists ages six to adult, with the intention of nurturing empathetic and thoughtful relationships and interactions between people by making space for collaboration and communication in the artistic process; helping individuals of all ages to express their most authentic and joyful selves through theatre, music, and movement. We aim to support artistic choices that embrace a diversity of perspectives and promote attitudes and actions that encourage more equitable power, access, and treatment for all.

Our education programs thrived in 2022!

- We welcomed over 300 young people into Next Generation School of Theatre class sessions that celebrated their imagination and individuality.
- We awarded 96 need-based scholarships, totaling \$11,500.
- We produced 3 KIDDSTUFF Theatre for Young Audience Productions that over 2,400 audience members attended, and we offered 391 complimentary tickets.
- We brought Project 4 Arts-in-the-Classroom Residencies into 2 school districts, 7 schools, and 25 individual classrooms, reaching approximately 450 students and 35 classroom educators.
- We employed 40+ creative, experienced Teaching Artists for our NextGen, Project 4, and Break-a-Leg programs.
- We brought together 16 talented Performance Fellows, from around the US (and Barbados) to perform in KIDDSTUFF, Mainstage, and Wedge FutureNow productions as part of our first ever compensated Performance Fellowship program.
- Three Drama League FutureNow Fellows joined us to direct the KIDDSTUFF TYA productions, AD on Mainstage shows, and lead the first ever Wedge FutureNow Festival.
- Four exceptional Design Fellows designed the KIDDSTUFF and Wedge FutureNow Series.





EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAMS

NEXT GENERATION SCHOOL OF THEATRE WINTER AND SPRING BREAK-A-LEG CAMP

Students spent their winter and spring breaks exploring the world of theatre and storytelling through games, improvisation exercises, movement work, and design projects that emphasized teamwork, imagination, creative exploration, and confidence building during the 2022 Next Generation School of Theatre Winter and Spring Break-a-Leg Camps.

NEXT GENERATION SCHOOL OF THEATRE SUMMER SESSIONS

The 2022 Next Generation School of Theatre offered a variety of summer sessions taught by skilled teaching artists, themes ranging from magical musicals, to improvisation, space adventure, super heroes, theatre for social change, creating a play, and much more! Students entering grades 1-10 gain confidence through activities that focus on craft, skill-building, and creative expression, and encourage them to express their most authentic and joyful selves through theatre, music, and movement. The Hangar provides need-based scholarships for every school-age program offered, to ensure all students have access to these programs, regardless of family resources.

PROJECT 4 ARTS-IN-THE-CLASSROOM RESIDENCIES

The Hangar's Project 4 Arts-in-the-Classroom residency program continues to be our most accessible and far-reaching community program, bringing experienced Teaching Artists into fourth-grade classrooms throughout Tompkins County to guide young people in the creation and performance of original, student-devised plays

inspired by NY State curriculum. Each residency concludes with a presentation, in which students share their play with an audience of other students, family, and community members.

We were thrilled to relaunch in-person Project 4 residencies in 2022, engaging with two Tompkins County school districts (Ithaca City School District and Dryden); 7 elementary schools (we will work with 10 in 2023); for a total of 25 classrooms (we anticipate 32 in 2023) and approximately 450 students and 35 classroom educators.

Performance days, held at the schools and at the Hangar, welcomed over 1000 invested family and community members to experience (in-person and virtually) the meaningful productions their young people created. All 4th grade students at participating schools engage with the program, and we work closely with classroom educators to make sure we are including neurodiverse and disabled students fully and meaningfully in the project creation and performance.

Project 4 teacher feedback in spring 2022 included the following comments: "Kids get so much more out of programs like these than they do sitting at a desk...Students were able to practice cooperation, risk-taking, performance, empathy, kindness, and so many other skills."; "We loved sharing with each other during our dress rehearsal but sharing with the families was even more touching and joyful. It was the first time families had been inside the school building in two years!"





We finished 2022 with a deficit, some of which was offset by an additional \$76,000 ERC (Employee Retention Tax Credit) we received from the IRS. More broadly, we learned from FY22 and entered FY23 with a clearer, more thoughtful, and better-informed plan for the year. While we approached 2022 with a sense of optimism, hoping that much would be "back to normal," we recognize now that this was not the case, both at the Hangar and industrywide. We acknowledge that our current task at hand continues to be assessing the needs of our specific patrons and communities, and determining which Hangar programs are most essential. We continue to do that, now working as a downsized staff and board to acknowledge and face head-on the actual trends of the past two years. We cannot serve our community if we do not remain financially solvent; stability and sustainability must now be our guiding principles.

Since 2022, we have also learned to scale our workforce and season expectations. Unfortunately, the theatre industry relied on unpaid or underpaid labor to sustain itself for decades. The Hangar committed to move away from that model, which exclusively rewarded artists with economic privilege. As part of our commitment to our EDIA goals, we eliminated unpaid production internships in 2021 and eliminated unpaid performance internships in 2022, and have now made the adjustments to paying fair wage balances in the budget. We also made great strides in our HR policies and procedures during the summer of 2022. Our Acting Managing Director, Alexa Allmann, and our dedicated Personnel Committee, made up of experienced HR professionals from the Hangar board, established systems that allowed staff members to report any situation that made them uncomfortable or impeded their work or learning through multiple means of communication, including anonymously. Reports were dealt with in a manner that was swift, thoughtful, and adhered to HR best practices. We also added several days to each rehearsal process, eliminating some of the detrimental pressure of urgency typically placed on performers, designers, and technicians and resulting in a healthier, happier, equitable work environment for everyone that will result in greater staff retention.

Our approach to creating a more sustainable producing model in 2023 included producing fewer Mainstage productions (three instead of five), while funneling the essential amount of resources into each production. We also maintained or increased our offerings for young people, both as patrons at KIDDSTUFF shows and as participants in Next Gen and Project 4 arts education programs. Indicators of project success include: increased participation in these programs (especially with young people from under-served areas of Tompkins County); establishing new partnerships and deepening pre-existing partnerships with other youth-serving local organizations; and increasing access overall by strengthening program offerings, especially Project 4 and other potential in-school residencies, which literally travel into the community and reach multiple neighborhoods, municipalities, and Qualified Census Tracts.

We are grateful to our community of supporters for all that we were able to accomplish in 2022 and look forward to continuing our work in providing an educational, stable, sustainable, and inspiring home for the arts in Ithaca for years to come.
