
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



JANE AUSTEN (December 16, 1775 – July 18, 1817) was an English novelist whose penchant for witty social commentary, celebrated romantic plots, and feminine perspective make her one of the most celebrated authors in British literature. Beginning with "Sense and Sensibility" in 1811, her novels were favorably received during her lifetime, although they were published anonymously. Austen wrote continuously from a young age and had the full support of her family, for whom she composed her first stories. Her novels deal primarily with the social lives of English landed gentry, especially the expectations of and about women, and the necessity of securing a good marriage. Although Austen herself never married novels like "Pride and Prejudice" and "Emma" are considered classics of the early nineteenth century romantic genre and are still widely read today.

KATE HAMILL is an actor / playwright. Named Playwright of the Year (2017)–Wall Street Journal. Her plays include *Sense and Sensibility* (in which she originated the role of Marianne)–Winner, Off-Broadway Alliance Award; Nominee, Drama League Award (Best Revival); 265+ performances off-Broadway. Other plays include Vanity Fair (in which she originated the role of Becky Sharp; Nominee, Off-Broadway Alliance Award), Pride and Prejudice (originated the role of Lizzy; Best Theatre of 2017–WSJ, Huffington Post), In the Mines Sundance Lab semi-finalist), Little Women, Em (Red Bull New Play finalist), and Little Fellow D'Neill semi-finalist). Her plays have been produced off-Broadway, at A.R.T., the Guthrie neater, Seattle Rep, PlayMakers Rep, Hudson Valley Shakespeare Festival, Dallas Theater Center, Folger Theatre (8 Helen Hayes Award nominations; Winner, best production–S&S) and others. Upcoming productions at Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Arvada Center, Jungle heater, Primary Stages, and more. Kate is currently working on new adaptations of Little Nomen, Mansfield Park, and The Odyssey, as well as several new original plays—including Love Poem and Prostitute Play. She was one of 2016's top 20 most produced playwrights in America; Sense and Sensibility was one of the top 10 most produced plays. www.kate-hamill.com
